The UK Gay Men's Sex Survey (part of EMIS - the European MSM Internet Sex survey)

Northern Ireland region of residence data report (March 2011)

This report contains data from the UK *Gay Men's Sex Survey* 2010, which was part of the European MSM Internet Sex Survey (EMIS), a pan-European survey about behaviours, prevention needs and interventions related to HIV and sexual health. The survey ran simultaneously in twenty-five European languages, and was promoted by over 200 websites across Europe. The survey was developed by academic researchers, public health officials and community-based organisations in these countries. EMIS has already released two documents reporting key variables for men resident in 38 countries across Europe, the *EMIS Community Report* #1 and the *EMIS UNGASS Indicators Report*. Both can be found in the <u>Publications</u> section at <u>www.emis-project.eu</u>. The indicators provided in this report are the same as those provided in these two reports.

This current report is prepared for health promotion planners with information about their local population of gay men and bisexual men. Respondents are grouped according to the Strategic Health Authority area in which they live. This report supplements the main UK survey report which will be published in September 2011. Survey methods and interpretation of the variables will be outlined in that report.

This data is intended to provide health promotion planners with information about the men living in their region in a way that can be compared with other groups of men. There are also data reports for each of the ten Strategic Health Authorities (SHA) in England, with men grouped according to their Primary Care Trust (PCT) of residence, and separate reports for Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales, with men grouped according to their region of residence. The data

The survey used a single data collection method via a specific website promoted via links on gay and HIV-related websites. The EMIS survey was available from 4th June to 31st August 2010, in 25 languages. 184,470 gay men and bisexual men took part internationally.

To be included in this report respondents had to: be male; be aged between 16 and 89; be living in Northern Ireland; have had sex with a man in the last year or have a gay, bisexual or other 'queer' identity.

Respondents with two or more inconsistent answers in six key areas were removed to improve data validity. Differences between the number of surveys returned and the number of men who appear in the sample are due to these exclusions.

The tables

Groups of men living in the same Health and Social Care Trust appear as a row (horizontal line) in the tables. The bottom row of each table gives the result for all men living in Northern Ireland. The first table shows the number of men recruited to the survey living in the Health and Social Care Trusts and the size of the sub-samples in the rest of the tables. The tables show the proportions (%) of each sub-sample for that variable (less missing data). Rows add up to 100%. The only exception to this layout is table 3, 'Age averages'.

Questionnaires

The contents page identifies the survey question number (Q) each table is derived from. The questionnaire used in the survey is available to download in the <u>Publications</u> section at <u>www.emis-project.eu</u>

Funding

EMIS was 60% funded by the Executive Agency for Health and Consumers of the European Commission and 40% funded by the five EMIS Associate Partners for their respective work-packages. In the UK the survey was part-funded by the Terrence Higgins Trust on behalf of CHAPS, the national HIV prevention programme funded by the English Department of Health.
